Course Description

This course is designed to develop the four language skills--speaking, listening, reading and writing-- in Korean. It covers the basic grammatical structures and vocabulary necessary for basic conversation, reading comprehension, and writing to have the students build a solid foundation for further study in the Korean language. The course also provides useful information concerning culture (where culture touches on language and communication) and everyday life in Korea. We will pay particular attention to cultivating skills in the following areas: maintaining simple face-to-face conversations by asking and answering simple questions entirely in Korean; listening and comprehending basic expressions; writing simple sentences and expressions; and comprehending simple written texts.

Grading: This course consists of daily writing assignments, weekly oral assignments (reading and speaking), written quizzes, lesson tests, two oral exam, midterm exam and final. Please note that the marks you receive in the second term will be weighted more (1st term 40: 2nd term 60).

1) Class attendance, participation and assignments:

(i) Attendance and participation

Regular attendance in class and active classroom participation is mandatory. Your attendance will be checked at the beginning of class, and absences will result in points lost. Arriving late or leaving early is considered as tardiness. Being tardy twice is considered as one absence. A maximum of 3 absences each term is allowed without affecting your grade. If you have more than 10 absences (i.e. missing 10 hours of class, being tardy 20 times, or any possible equivalent combination) each term, you will automatically fail the course regardless of your performance.

(ii) Assignments (written and oral)

- a. All written assignments are due at the beginning of class. Homework submitted after the class has started will receive no credit. A maximum of 10 missing assignments each term is allowed without affecting your grade.
- b. Your assignments will be returned to you with your mistakes or errors circled. You should attempt to correct your own errors using the textbook and class notes, and submit them with the new assignments next day. Failing to do so will be considered as missing a written assignment.
- c. All your tests will be returned to you with your mistakes or errors circled. You should correct your own mistakes using the textbook and class notes, and submit them the next day. Failing to do so will be considered as missing a written assignment.
- d. Oral assignment is posted on *Connect* every Monday morning, and is due at 9PM every Friday. You will not get any credit if you miss the deadline although you can get feedback only upon your request. You must complete both Reading and Speaking parts, and Reading part will be graded on 1-5 scale. You must check your previous week's assignments every week and re-record if you received any feedback or corrections. Failing to do so will be considered as missing an oral assignment. A maximum of 2 missing assignments each term is allowed without affecting your grade.

2) Quizzes and tests

Make-up exams and quizzes will be granted and receive full credits ONLY with valid official documents (e.g. doctor's notes, court's notices, etc.). If you miss written quizzes or tests for any other reasons (including family emergency, attending a wedding or funeral, emergency evacuation in your apartment, work shift, bad conditions, etc.), you will receive only 70% credit for make-up exams and quizzes. No exceptions will be made. Please make sure you arrive on time for exam or tests. You will not be given more time to finish your exam or test even if you were late and didn't have time.

- 3) It is your responsibility to keep track of your performance and take any necessary measures. NO adjustments (e.g. by doing "extra credit" work, etc.) will be made at the end of term for any reasons.
- 4) Please note that NO use of personal electronic devices is allowed in class. Using laptops for note-taking will be permitted only for medical reasons.
